The emphasis is to make skills training more relevant, efficient, and responsive to emerging domestic and international labor markets. The reports were finalized in 2013 under the Australian AID-supported Phase 1 of Subproject 11 (*Innovative Strategies for Accelerated Human Resource Development*) of Regional Technical Assistance 6337 (Development Partnership Program for South Asia).
